Vestavia student leaves track meet fastest gal in state

When most fearns headed for the State Outdoor Track Meet last weekend, they packed their school's top athletes on buses and vans and carted them all down to Selma.

But there was no need for Vestavia Junior High School to rent a bus for their girl's team to go — the team is one girl.

Cameron "Cam" Sharbel, pigtails tied with red ribbons flapping in the breeze, was her school's only hope in the junior high girl's mile

Her best time going into state competition was five minutes and 28 seconds which figured her to be a strong competitor.

She would be tough to best, but when she rounded the corner after completing three laps it was apparent that she even bettered her own best

In fact, five minutes and 22.08 seconds later, the Vestavia Junior High School student had set a new state record in the mile run.

"At the start I stayed in second then Grissom and Opelika got in front of me," she recalls. "I settled in at third position, but when I got to the last 220 I figured this was the state so I got to do well."

SHARBEL ADDS that seeing the finish line really made her pour it on — not to mention Ann Koski of Mountain Brook Junior High hot on her heels finishing a close second with five minutes

This was Sharbel's first year competing in the state outdoor meet even though she already had won the state cross country event in Mobile last November.

There was an <u>article in the Cleveland Plain Dealer on Friday</u> about plans for the Saturday night event. Similarly, in California, <u>KGET reported on plans in Bakersfield</u> and <u>10news reported on plans in San Diego</u>. In Seattle, <u>over 1000 people were expected to participate</u>.

News is also beginning to come in about attendance at the events around the world. In Rochester, NY, there is already a report from WROC, a local television station, saying that 200 people in that city participated in the night commute last night. In Augusta, GA, more than 25 people participated in the march, and in Aiken County, GA, participants numbered over 200 (story here, login required or use bugmenot.com). In Austin, TX, the Austin American Statesman reported that hundreds of college students walked from the clock tower at the UT campus to the grounds of the state capitol to participate in the night commute. There are also photos of this event available at Flickr already, and here's a story from an Austin TV station. In San Francisco, over 500 people gathered, according to the local CBS news station. In Chicago, over 2000 people gathered in Grant Park, including one teenager from Uganda who now attends a private school in the US thanks to the folks at Invisible Children. Invisible Children Update: Truce in Northern Uganda






